

Spectator Driving Directions to Boys' and Girls' Track Meets

Beloit Memorial High School

Take I-90 south about 45 miles to exit 185A, the exit for WI-81 West. Turn right off the ramp on to WI-81 W. WI-18 is Milwaukee Road at this point but changes names a couple times as you travel west. Travel west 3.5 miles, then turn right onto 4th St, which you will see very shortly after you cross a river. 4th St is also WI-81 and WI-213. You should be heading north. The school is about 0.4 mi ahead on the right, marked with a B on the map in the maps section below. You can see on the map that the track is just north of the school. The high school address is 1225 4th St, Beloit. Mapquest say 56 miles and 68 minutes from West High.

Cudahy High School

location of a girls only meet, is located at 4950 South Lake Drive, Cudahy. Take I-94 toward Milwaukee. About 65 miles from Madison, take Exit 305 A on to I-894 toward Chicago. Drive approximately 9 miles, then exit at Exit 9, 27th St South. Turn right on to S 27th. Head south 0.2 mi. There turn left on to Layton Ave, also County Y. Head east 5 miles. Along the way what was E Layton Ave becomes W Layton Ave. After 5 mi total on the Laytons, turn right onto South Lake Drive. The school is 0.3 mi ahead on the left. The meet is in the school's field house. 88 mi and 1 hr 40 minutes from West according to Mapquest.

Lussier Stadium

is the home stadium for Madison East and Madison LaFollette. Lussier is located behind La Follette High School. Park at the HS or at Sennett Middle School. The Sennett parking lot might be a little more convenient to the track. Sennett Middle School is located at 502 Plum Road, about a block east of the intersection of Plum and Monona Drive. La Follette is just east of Sennett at 702 Pflaum Road. Take the beltline to Monona Drive. Head north a little over a mile to Pflaum. If the lot is full, try the residential area across Pflaum from the two schools. Note that as you travel north on Monona Drive from the belt line, look for Pflaum road on the *right* (east side). The continuation of Pflaum Road on the west side of Monona Road is called Nichols. There is a Walgreens on the corner of Pflaum and Monona Road. 18 minutes from West according to mapquest.com.

Mansfield Stadium

is the home stadium for Madison West and Madison Memorial. Mansfield is located behind Memorial High School on Mineral point road just east of Gammon Road.

Middleton High School Stadium

is located at north of Middleton High School at the north terminus of Bristol Street in Middleton. Take University Ave to Middleton. After U Ave bends to the left into Middleton, pass the strip mall on the left and look then look for Bristol on the right, two blocks past Park. Turn right on to Bristol and proceed past the high school to the parking lot at the north end of Bristol. The track is just north of the parking lot. The high school address is 2100 Bristol Street, Middleton, WI. Mapquest says its 12 minutes from West

Monona Grove High School

stadium, venue for the Monona Grove Invite, is located at 4400 Monona Drive, Monona, about two miles north of the Beltline and north of the golf course on the right side of the road. The track is behind the school to the east of Monona Road on East Coldspring Road. Turn right (head east) on East Coldspring to find the track. Spectators: take all no-parking signs seriously! The local city governments (both Monona and Madison) seem to view this event as a fundraising opportunity. Its worth a drive through the school parking lot to see if a spot is open. Mapquest says 19 minutes from West

Monterey Stadium

is the home stadium for Janesville Craig and Janesville Parker. Monterey is located at 465 Rockport Road in Janesville. Directions from I-90 South: Take 175 A. You should end up heading approximately west away from I-90. The fifth stoplight, Jackson St, is a one-way road heading left. So, go left onto Jackson. Drive approximately 1/4 mile to Riverside Street. Turn right onto Riverside St and look for the stadium. Mapquest says 45 miles and 55 minutes from West.

Quad Park

in Milwaukee is the home stadium for Marquette University High School and the site of the Marquette Invite (boys). Quad Park is located at 38th St and St Paul Ave in Milwaukee. Exit I-94 at the 35th St exit, which is not far from Miller Park. Proceed north on 35th a few blocks to St. Paul Avenue. Turn left (west) onto St. Paul Ave. Travel three blocks to Quad Park. Free parking has been available in the grass lawn across from the track entrance on 35th St in past years. There is a second grass lot in the vicinity plus 120 diagonal street parking spots on 39th street one block west of the track. Mapquest says 78 miles and 88 minutes from West ... if there is no Brewers game. (Note there is a nice view of Miller Park from the track.)

Stoughton High School,

600 Lincoln Ave in Stoughton. Take Hwy 51 (Stoughton Road) south to Roby Road. Turn left on Roby Road to Lincoln Ave. Turn right on Lincoln. Or, take 14 south toward Oregon/Stoughton. About 6 mi south of the Beltline, turn left on to WI-138 and travel about 6 mi. Merge onto US 51. In about half a mile, turn left onto Hamilton and then immediately left onto Lincoln and drive north to 600 Lincoln Ave., Stoughton. Mapquest says 31 minutes from West. Note that only the girls compete in the Stoughton Invite.

Sun Prairie High School

is located at 888 Grove St. in Sun Prairie. Mapquest suggests taking 94E to Country Road E at exit 244. Go North on N toward Sun Prairie, about 5 miles. N is Grove Street. IF you get to E Main Street, you passed the NEW high school. You can also get there from 151. Exit on the Sun Prairie-West Main Street (looks like business 151). Take West Main through Sun Prairie. It becomes East Main. Turn right on to N / Grove Street. Highschool is just ahead on west side of Grove. 18 miles and about 29 minutes from West High at the speed limit.

The UW Shell

is located at 1430 Monroe St. There should be parking available in the ramp to the north of the football stadium know as UW Lot 17. To access it, take Engineering Drive off of Randall. Engineering Drive runs parallel to University Ave, one block south of it, and is just one block long. It connects Randall and UW Lot 17. Engineering Drive looks more like an access road to the engineering campus than a road per se. Park in the ramp or surface lot. Both are free on the

weekends as long as there is no special enough event going on. In 2009 parking in Lot 17 was free. To get to the UW Shell entrance, walk through the tunnel along the east side of the football stadium.

UW La Crosse Veteran's Memorial Stadium

is the venue for the state meet. The UW La Crosse website lists 1725 State Street as the address. 1757 Pine Street appears to be a better address for a parking lot that is adjacent to the track at its 2009 location. Because of the crowds, this address and parking lot probably is a good place to start your hunt for a place to park. There is paid parking in some of the adjacent UW La Crosse lots and free street parking if you are willing to walk a few blocks. Note that the stadium was to be torn down immediately after the 2009 state meet, the last event hosted there, and replaced with a larger one in time for the 2010 state meet on approximately the same site. The map shows the 2009 layout. Take I-90 to La Crosse. Get off at Exit 5 in order to take WI-16 toward Onalaska/La Crosse. Head south on WI-16 about 5 miles. Turn right on La Cross St, which is still WI-16. From here you could continue to 19th st, turn left there and look for parking at the north end of the stadium complex. You could also turn left on 24th (which comes first) and then an immediate right on Campbell, then right on Pine, which should put you approximately at the south end of the stadium. Mapquest says 144 miles and 2 hour 36 minutes from West.

UW Whitewater's Kachel Field house

(girls meet) is located on the UW-Whitewater campus at location KC on Warhawk Drive on the map that follows. It looks like Starin Rd and Warhawk Drive (called Winnebago on some maps) might be a good location to enter into your GPS's, as it gets you near ample parking. The following are Mapquest's directions to that location: Take I90 south to exit 163 (Milton/Edgerton/WI 59). Head east on WI 59 for about 3 mi. Turn left on to county N and head east/north for about 12 mi. (County N becomes West Walworth Ave approximately 10.5 miles along the way.) At about 12 miles from WI-59, turn left onto Prince St. Travel north 0.8 mi. Then turn right on to West Starin Road. Warhawk Drive is 0.1 mile ahead. Turn left onto Warhawk, to head north. There appears to be ample parking in lots immediately ahead on both the left and the right sides of Warhawk. The best option might be the lot with entrance immediately on the left if you head to its north end, where it is arc shaped. Mapquest says 46 miles and 1 hour from West HS.

Waunakee High School

The high school and the track/are listed as being at 301 Community Drive. Mapquest cannot find that address, but the following directions get you to a track and football field shown on Community Drive on the aerial picture map, so they presumably are correct. Take University Ave heading west. Turn right on to Allen Blvd then right again on to Century Ave, then left on to County Q. Go 4.7 mi on Q. Turn right on to Woodland. Go 0.2 mi. There turn right on to Simon Crestway. Go 0.3 mi. There turn left on to South St. Go what looks to be about 0.2 mi and turn left on to Community Drive. There should be parking on your right and a track/football stadium on your left about a quarter mile down the road.
